CHAIR'S REPORT

One evening recently a plot holder fell in her greenhouse and smashed through the glass. There were very few people about but luckily her cry was heard and people came to her aid, called the ambulance and went to hospital with her, where she had many stitches in her arm before going home. This is a wake-up call to us all that we are responsible for our own safety (and that of our visitors) when on site (see RGS Rule 14). Think about where help might come from if you need it – do you have a mobile phone? Can you see other plot holders around?



SHARDS OF GLASS FROM THE GREENHOUSE

I have been in touch with St John's Ambulance for advice on Health and Safety and we are considering a proposal to prohibit the use of glass for any NEW structures on our plots in the future. All comments or suggestions are most welcome - please contact me as below.

Please check to see if the common paths round your plot are safe; some look rather dangerous despite reminders from the Site Secretaries. We are obliged to keep them well maintained and free from hazards (see WBC Tenancy Agreement point 10). The Tenancy Agreement and RGS Rules are on our website www.roehamptonallotments.co.uk if you would like to refresh your memory of them.

Most plot holders are thoughtful, talented and generous! This month (to name just a few things our members volunteer for) they have given up their time to take the rents, let and inspect the plots, written the bulletin, worked in the Store, cleaned toilets, taken (other people's) dumped rubbish to the tip, helped with stock deliveries, cut the grass, repaired broken taps, prepared legal documents and put up the new Store shed on Site 3. The RGS would grind to a halt without you all. Thank you!

We will need people to help with the smooth running of our Show on 11 June but before then, on Sunday 22 May between 10am and 12 noon, both our sites will be open to members of the Wandsworth Horticultural Society. We will need help on both sites to welcome visitors at the gates and on the plots. Please let me know if you can give an hour or so of your time, or you might prefer just to be on your plot to give a cheerful hello!

A Lease has been prepared, hopefully acceptable to both the Charities Commission and the Council who are considering it. Hopefully we will hear quite soon and move forward with our objective to become a Charity with a long Lease for the allotment land.

STORE REPORT

The weather is far cooler than we would like but it was still good to see many members visiting the Store this last month to buy seeds and soil improvers in readiness for when the weather improves and we can start planting for summer (it will improve sometime, surely!).

Country Natural is still flying out the door and we are trying to keep up with demand. This product is so popular across the country that we now have to put an order in two weeks in advance instead of one. We have run out of this on a couple of occasions this year partly because of this and also due to the shed on Site 3 being obliterated in the storms that did so much damage to some of our allotments on Site 3. We can only order what we have space to store, so this meant that we had to limit the size of our orders.

I am pleased to say that we now have a new shed for storing Country Natural on Site 3 thanks to Greg Wilcox who sourced the shed and then gave up his own time to erect it. We are most grateful to Greg for this. We have an order of 75 bags of Country Natural arriving on Thursday, 28 April!



We are trialing some new products in the Store. A 10 litre watering can selling at £4.50 each and also pea and bean netting, 2m by 5m, at £5 which can provide vertical or lateral support for peas, sweet peas and beans and the like. If there is an interest in these products, we can order some more, so do let us have your feedback.

Please note some amendments have been made to the ways discounts are offered to members at two local Garden Centres.

On presentation of your RGS membership card you will receive 10% discount on horticultural goods that you take away with you, not on delivered items.

Firstly, you need to register for their loyalty card, as an RGS member. You will be asked to show your membership card, give your name, email address and post-code. You will get 7% retrospective discount on goods purchased, which can be redeemed at the time of the next purchase (like a Nectar card). The amount of discount is recorded as 'points' on the card and shown on each till receipt. Points worth £5.00 will be put on your card as a thank you when you register.

If you are over 50, and a loyalty card member, on Wednesdays you will receive 10% discount instead of the 7% on other days.

NATIONAL PARK LONDON

Have you heard about the new initiative, to get London designated as the world's first National Park City!

This National Park will create a partnership that links up and supports all the hundreds of local people and organisations that work towards making London a greener, healthier, happier place to live. The purpose is to give every Londoner access to the green space and opportunities to engage with wildlife that are vital to physical and mental wellbeing. Also a partnership of London wide local enthusiasts will be able to have a voice on larger scale planning issues.

This initiative already has the support of The London Assembly and all the mayoral candidates as well all the organisations and individuals who have crowd-funded the proposal for a charter. This is described in full on the website at http://www.nationalparkcity.london/

What can we do? As individuals we can find out more and declare our support. Then contact our local electoral ward councilors to ask them to declare our ward's support. All the details and a suggested email are on the website. Follow the 'Declare your support' link.

When more than half of the wards have declared their support the organisers will ask the government to declare London a National Park City. 180 out of 436 wards have declared already, so we are well on the way!

April Recipe

Radishes are nearly ready. This recipe caught my eye in The Guardian's Cook.

Sweet and Sour Braised Radishes

2 tbsp. runny honey

1 tbsp. lemon juice

1 tbsp. cider vinegar

2 tsp. olive oil

1 tsp. unsalted butter

1-bunch radishes (about 300g)

Salt and pepper

Chives

Wash, trim and halve or slice the radishes. Put honey, lemon juice & cider vinegar in a small screw top jar and shake to combine.

Put olive oil, butter, radishes in a pan and fry for a couple of minutes over a high heat. Pour the honey mixture over the radishes, stir and cook over a medium heat for 4-5 minutes.

Season and sprinkle with chopped chives.

Serve over green leaves, over baked Feta cheese or on top of cheese on toast. Delicious!
