CHAIR'S REPORT APRIL 2015

April is rent collection month and you are now able to pay your rent by direct bank transfer, if you are unable to come to the Store to pay. The Store will be open for payment of rents and for sales of goods Weds evenings from 6–7 and Sunday morning from 10-12 throughout the month, starting on Weds 1 April.

Plot inspections took place in March and some plots have changed hands recently on both sites. Please remember that if you would like more land (up to your limit of 5 rods per household) or would like to move then you MUST put your name on the waiting list. You will then be contacted when you reach the top of the list.

We have now put in an application to register the Charity. The six "founder" trustees, chosen for their skills, are Sarah Purcell, Robert Linton, George Casley, Stewart Tamsett, Anthony Fitzsimmons and me. All are plot holding members of RGS and I am the only member of our current committee. Thank you to those who have done all the work on this application completely free of charge. Once we have a reply from the Charities Commission I will let you know what our options are.

I hope by now the final lock has been fitted to the Dover House Gate on Site 3 and the last trees pruned at Site 2. Many thanks to those people who make these things possible, particularly our helpful and friendly neighbours! If there are other improvements you would like to suggest please don't hesitate to let me know. Happy Easter!

DIGGING CAN BE FUN!

STORE REPORT

The Store is extremely well stocked for spring and Easter planting!

There are many soil additives and fertilisers to meet all your growing needs, and a fabulous selection of Kings seeds and root trainers. We have composts, canes, netting, string, tools, sprays and a great many loose products at very competitive prices, to name but a few. Remember to ask for an application leaflet for any of the loose products, when purchased. The best thing is to come in and browse, so you have an idea what we are now offering.

Dried Seaweed

As you know, we have had great difficulty in obtaining dried seaweed (a firm favourite for organic growing, as our original supplier in the Shetland Isles are no longer trading. But after researching a comparable supplier, we have finally found one, so within the next two weeks we shall have it back in the Store. Wonderful for adding to all plants!

Now is the time to cover your crops with **Wondermesh**, from sowing to harvest (but remove if there are flowers that need to be insect pollinated). It protects the crops from so many of our common pests and is perfect for you, especially if you are growing organically.

WONDERFUL WONDERMESH – 3.6 metres wide @ £4 per metre.

There is a large roll on the table in the store and we may ask you to help measure it out and cut it to size. Please work out how much you need before you come, remember you may want to cover hoops or a stand and the mesh should be secured into the ground all round the crop for maximum benefit. Pegs are on sale at 10p each.

Mesh Statistics: Mesh size 0.8 mm: National light levels: 85%: UV stabilised

The mesh will protect from pigeons, crows and the weather as well as the following common pests:

Carrot Root Fly: emerge between May - June & August - September

Cabbage Root Fly: Emerge between April - May & August – September

Flea Beetle: Most active in April – May & August

Allium Leaf Miner: Protect leeks, onions, garlic, shallots & chives. Most active from March – June & September – November.

Rubbed Kale

Shred the kale finely. Put in a large bowl and scoop into the palms of your hands and rub together. Drop and scoop and rub again repeatedly. You will soon feel the kale soften and go a darker green as it is broken down. Pile on top of a serving of any hot dish, for example a helping of casserole. Drizzle with lemon juice and a few grinds of pepper.
