NEWS FROM THE STORE

The sales of garlic have gone very well this year, so much so that we had to reorder to satisfy demand.

Our current offer on Kings Seeds has also proved popular. As Kings Seeds no longer take seed packets back which have just passed their 'sow by' date, we are offering one of these packets with every in date packet of seeds purchased, while stocks last.

Please note that we are withdrawing Bordeaux Mixture and Copper Fungicide from our shelves from 30 November. This is due to EU

regulations, which has banned them for amateur use as it has been found that a build up of copper in the soil may be harmful to worms and could be harmful to fish if it leaches into water. We will be looking into alternatives.

SEED POTATOES AND ONION SETS ON SALE IN JANUARY

Once again we will be selling seed potatoes in the store from early January. As we buy the potatoes in bulk from a respected seed potato producer in Scotland we can sell them to you at a very competitive price. They will be sold by the kilo or individually meaning you can try a few of each if you only have a small plot.

There will be 4 varieties

First Early: Arran Pilot. A very early traditional 'new' potato that was popular in the 30's. Excellent yield and flavour

Second Early: Kestrel. A good all rounder especially for making chips and roasts. Good resistance to slug damage.

Second Early / Salad: Charlotte. Has a uniform shape and is great as a salad potato.

Main crop: Picasso. Good for roasts and mash. Good disease resistance. Stores well

See the picture of Leslie's huge Picasso potatoes.

We will also sell onion sets and shallots for spring planting, we will buy them in bulk from King's so again you can mix and match as many as you like at a good competitive price.

Red Karmen: A red skinned, flattened globe shape. Flesh is white with light crimson circles between the scales. A fine and sweet taste means it is good for both salads and cooking. They cannot be planted until April. These onions store well.

Sturon: A white fleshed onion with light gold skin. Globe shaped and

with very crisp flesh. It has long storage qualities.

Golden Gourmet: A shallot with excellent flavour and splitting ability. It is a very high yielding golden brown variety with high bolting resistance. These shallots store well over winter.

We will send around an email with prices as soon as we have the deliveries. The store will be closed in December and re-open on Sunday 10th January 2016 – hopefully all the above will be available to buy on this date.

PLOT INSPECTIONS

The next plot inspections will be in mid-November. The inspection team usually consists of at least three Committee members (the Site Manager and the two Site Secretaries), and one non-Committee member.

What the team would expect to see in November is that:

- The plot has been tidied up for the winter so there would be guite a lot of bare ground.
- Weeds are under control and particularly not likely to invade any neighbouring plots either by sending out runners or by spreading seeds.
- Surrounding paths are not obstructed and are reasonably well maintained.

Where the inspection team identifies a problem the plot holder

will be contacted. The aim is to give guidance and encouragement but if there have been problems with cultivation in the past the team will take this into account. We are mindful that there is a lengthening Waiting List and since allotments are a public facility in high demand and short supply we have a responsibility to ensure plots are well used.

Please let us know if there are any particular circumstances (e.g. illness or injury) that have prevented you from looking after your plot.

BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP



INGREDIENTS

3 tbsp olive oil, plus a splash extra

2 red onions, finely chopped 3 garlic cloves, crushed 2 red chillies, deseeded and finely chopped

1 butternut squash (about 1.2kg), peeled, deseeded and chopped into chunks 1 large floury potato, cut into chunks

chunks
A few rosemary sprigs
1.25 litres chicken or
vegetable stock, hot
100g streaky bacon, finely
chopped (optional)
Splash of double cream
Pumpkin seed oil or extravirgin olive oil to drizzle

METHOD

Heat the oil in a large saucepan and gently fry the onions for 15minutes until soft. Add the garlic and chillies and cook for 1-2 minutes.

Add the squash, potato, rosemary sprigs and hot stock. Season well and bring to the boil, then reduce to a simmer and cook for 15-20 minutes until the squash is tender. Meanwhile, fry the bacon in a splash of oil until crisp, and then drain on kitchen paper.

Once the soup is cooked, blend with a stick blender (or blend in batches in a stand blender) and stir in the cream. Taste and adjust the seasoning, then serve with the crumbled streaky bacon scattered over and a drizzle of pumpkin seed oil or extravirgin olive oil. The soup can be frozen in a sealed container for up to 3 months. If freezing, prepare the bacon garnish just before serving.
