8. *Vase of cut flowers, 3 or more kinds with any foliage, arranged for all round effect (Society vases to be used, available on day)
9. *Arrangement in a goblet of flowers and/or leaves
10. A vase of perennial flowers of any one kind.
11. A miniature flower arrangement in a vessel measuring no more than $5 \times 5 \mathrm{~cm}$, e.g. an egg cup.
12. My favourite pot plant.

16. 12 pods of mangetout or sugar snap (not mixed)
17. 2 courgettes, any colour or shape
