Section A - Flowers

- Vase containing 1 HT rose, any colour.
- 2. The most beautiful / fragrant rose in the garden judged by visitors to the show.
- 3. *Vase of multiflora roses, 3 stems of any one variety
- 4. *Bowl of any number of roses arranged for an all-round effect
- 5. Vase of 6 stems of sweet peas, any 1 variety
- 6. Vase of 12 stems of sweet peas, can be mixed varieties
- 7. Vase or bowl of pansies or violas with own foliage, not more than 12 stems, can be mixed
- *Vase of cut flowers, 3 or more kinds with any foliage, arranged for all round effect (Society vases to be used, available on day)
- 9. *Arrangement in a goblet of flowers and/or leaves
- A vase of flowers of any kind, can include wild flowers and grasses.
- 11. A miniature flower arrangement in a vessel measuring no more than 5x5 cm, e.g. an egg cup.
- 12. My favourite pot plant.

Section B - Vegetables

- 13. 3 asparagus spears
- 14. 6 pods of broad beans
- 15. 12 pods of peas
- 16. 12 pods of mangetout or sugar snap (not mixed)
- 17. 2 courgettes, any colour or shape
- 18. 4 potatoes of any one variety
- 19. a) 3 garlic bulbs with 25mm stem
 - b) 3 elephant garlic bulbs
- 20. 3 sticks of rhubarb (natural)
- 21. 3 different herbs, in small bunches (no more than 25cm)
- 22. 3 onions, autumn sown, as dug, unwashed and with roots and tops intact.
- 23. A display of 3 different seasonal vegetables that you like in a salad (see description below)
- 24. Any other vegetable not listed above.

Flower/vegetable/fruit - mixed

B25. *1 specimen each of 1 flower, 1 fruit and 1 vegetable

B26. Any one fruit/vegetable/plant you are proud to display

Salad vegetable (From RHS show handbook)

"A vegetable used in either a raw or cooked state and served in salads as a cold dish. The following examples are kinds that may be used for horticultural show purposes: beetroot, cabbages, carrots, celeriac, celery, chicory, chives, corn salad, lamb's lettuce, cress, cucumber, dandelion, endive, Florence fennel, kohlrabi, lettuces, onions, oriental brassicas, potatoes, radishes, sweet peppers, tomatoes, turnips and watercress".

Section C – Fruit (All fruit to be displayed at their best on a small plate so that each individual fruit can be seen)

- 27. 15 gooseberries
- 28. 15 raspberries, with calyx
- 29. 12 strawberries, with calyx
- 30. Display of any other kind of fruit

Section D – Novices For members who have never won first prize for an exhibit.

- 31. A vase of 3 stems of any one variety of roses.
- 32. A display of vegetables, numbers as classes B13-B24.
- 33. A display of fruit, numbers as classes C27-C30

Section E – Cookery / Cake Off

34. *A cake of any type decorated with an allotment theme. Any real flowers used must be edible e.g., pansies and nasturtiums.
